The Legacy of Harry T. Moore



**A presentation by Juanita Barton,
Director of the Harry T. and
Harriette V. Moore Memorial Park
and Cultural Center**

Born in the Florida Panhandle town of Houston in 1905, Harry Tyson Moore came to Brevard County to teach in Cocoa in 1925. He met and married Harriette Vyda Simms and they settled in Mims to begin what would become an extraordinary life together.

He became a respected teacher and later principal in Brevard's segregated education system. He founded the Brevard Chapter of the NAACP, led voter registration drives, organized political campaigns. He pursued civil rights in areas such as housing, pay for teachers, education, voting rights, and justice in the courts.

On Christmas night, 1951, a bomb exploded under the Moore's home killing Harry and later Harriette. It was the first murder of a prominent civil rights leader and was felt nation wide.

Join us to examine his contributions and his role in the continuing struggle for equality for all Americans.

She now serves as the director of the Moore Cultural Complex. She'll share her research and the lessons and inspiration she learned from the Moores' friends and students with us.
